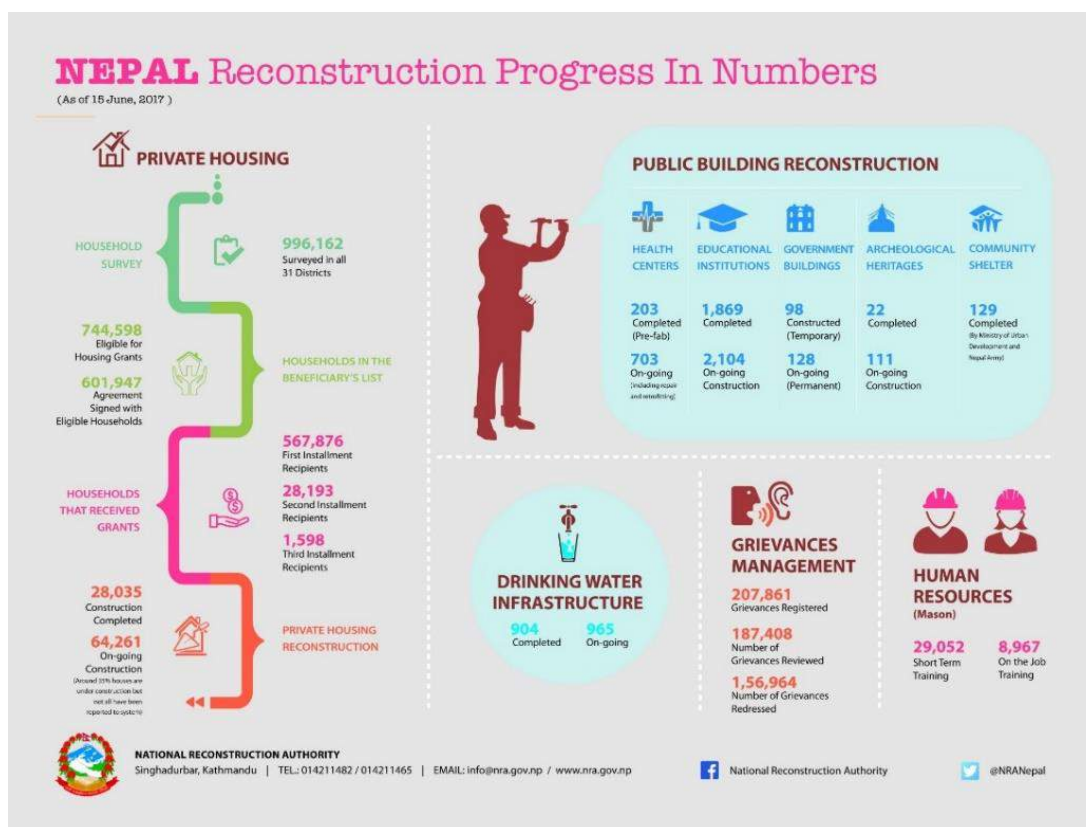

Citizen Helpdesk Bulletin, Issue No. 5: the Citizen Helpdesks are groups of young volunteers called Community Frontline Associates (CFAs) who gather and disseminate information on critical issues affecting Nepali citizens. The aim is to eliminate information gaps between the government, the media, donor organisations, and communities; and improve collective decision-making. The report presents questions collected and answers provided, and includes case stories from the field.

NRA Appeal for Expanded Support for Vulnerable Top Ups and Technical Assistance (English, Nepali): The NRA has issued an appeal urging I/NGOs, private sector, and philanthropic organisations to expand support for the vulnerable top up grant of 50,000 NPRs and / or technical assistance. NRA is also asking partners to encourage and support households that have already received the first tranche to finish construction to plinth level and request the second tranche by the middle of June.

HRRP Media Digest, some interesting articles include:

84% of damaged houses made of stone and mud: The Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS) on Sunday made public summary level statistics and data from the damage assessments conducted in the earthquake affected districts to identify eligible households for the housing reconstruction grant. According to the survey, 84.2%of severely damaged houses were constructed using stone and mud mortar masonry, 5.4% were constructed using cement

and brick/stone masonry (wall system), 5.8% were constructed using bamboo or timber, and 4.1% were constructed using RCC frames. The average age of a severely damaged house was found to be 25 years.

[An attempt to include vulnerable groups in reconstruction \(Nepali\)](#): The NRA has decided to include the poor, marginalized, differently abled, women and Dalits in the reconstruction. In this regard, they have come up with: 3 lakhs interest-free loans for the poor, 2 lakhs for the landless quake victims, 2 lakhs for the relocation of hazard-prone settlements, 50 thousand top-up for vulnerable groups, priority for the vulnerable groups in livelihood trainings, easing of grievance handling, guarantee of participation in the policy making, and additional alternatives in livelihood.

[NRA proposes bringing four CL-PIUs under its authority](#): Following challenges with coordination between National Reconstruction Authority (NRA) and four Central Level Project Implementation Units (MoE, Ministry of Culture, Tourism, and Civil Aviation, MoUD, and MoFALD), the NRA has asked the government to put those units under its authority.

[Civil Scholarship Fund Announcement by NRNA-Thailand](#): NRNA-Thailand is providing long term support for disadvantaged children via a Civil Scholarship Fund, a fund in coordination with Civil Initiative, a non-profit education focused organization in Nepal. The fund, of 3,589,999 NPRs, provides scholarships to 80 Nepali students each year, with priority to earthquake-victim children for the first five years.

[Quake victims to receive subsidised timber at NPRs. 2,425 per cubic foot \(Nepali\)](#): According to the Director General of Timber Corporation of Nepal, each earthquake victim will receive 50 cubic foot of timber to reconstruct their house at 2,425 NPRs per cubic foot from Balkumari Depo. The current market price of the timber is 5,500 NPRs per cubic foot.

[Displaced quake victims to be resettled in government land \(Nepali\)](#): The displaced quake victims are currently living in Baskharka of Jugal Rural Municipality, formerly known as Selang VDC, after leaving their village due to high risk of landslides. There are 178 households living in the IDP camp. Rudra Malla from NRA mentioned that the resettlement of displaced quake victims will be started soon.

[NRA CEO Pokharel meets acting German Ambassador](#): Jacqueline Groth, acting German Ambassador to Nepal, expressed interest in reconstruction of cultural heritage sites during a meeting with NRA CEO Dr. Govind Raj Pokharel on Monday. Ambassador Groth vowed to extend support to Nepal in the ongoing rebuilding works. She was particularly interested in supporting the reconstruction of Bhaktapur heritage site and is worried about the reconstruction delays.

[Establishment of Diplomatic Relations between Nepal and Uganda](#): Nepal and Uganda have established diplomatic relations on 13 June. The number of countries with which Nepal established diplomatic relations has now reached 145.

[MoUD CLPIU training on Correction/Exception Manual](#): MoUD- CLPIU has already finalised the vendor/s to conduct training on correction/exception manual to train District DLPIU Engineers. MoUD-CLPIU will first train the vendors on the manual on 22-23 June. The vendor will then be conducting the training in the districts.

[NSET celebrates 24th NSET Day](#): NSET celebrated its 24th NSET Day yesterday with a motto: "A Day to reaffirm commitment of earthquake safety". The event included speech by local representatives, experts, government officials, cultural shows as well as inauguration of a new report entitled "Safer Society".

Social Mobilisation for Reconstruction, Experience Sharing Session: HRRP and MoUD CL-PIU will be holding this session to encourage partners to discuss experience to date, and to consider recommendations for implementing large scale socio-technical assistance to support households through the reconstruction process. The session will take place during this week – keep an eye out for the invitation!

HRRP District Orientations on the Corrections and Exceptions Manual: these orientations are for those interested to get a general overview of the corrections manual and how it will be implemented. The orientations have already been conducted in Dolakha, Gorkha, Kathmandu, and Sindhupalchok. The other districts are scheduled as follows: Kavre and Ramechhap on 19 June, Okhaldhunga and Rasuwa on 21 June, Sindhuli and Dhading on 22 June. Decisions from the 20th meeting of the NRA Executive Committee (Nepali), 13 June: include changes in the provisions and revision of the Grant Disbursement Procedures to mitigate confusions and ease the process. Decision1: In the 17th meeting, the Executive Committee formed a review committee in coordination of Executive Committee Member Dr. Bishnu Bahadur Bhandari to go through the draft Procedures on the Training Conduction and Management for Reconstruction and Recovery, 2073, and come up with any amendment. The executive committee decided to approve the final draft of the Procedures that have been discussed and prepared by the review committee.

NRA CEO Dr. Govind Raj Pokharel, Executive Member Dr. Hari Ram Parajuli and the Central team visit Gorkha on 2nd June, 2017: The team attended an orientation and interaction program with newly-elected local representatives. The event was organized by NRA secretariat of the District Coordination Committee, Gorkha. WASH Sector Meeting held in NRA: The meeting was organised by NRA on 12 June. The agenda and main discussion and decisions can be found [here](#).

Stakeholders meeting held in NRA Dolakha: An interaction meeting with stakeholders was held in the NRA Secretariat Office on 9 June where several [decisions](#) (Nepali and English) were made.

President of Nepal: Women's empowerment underpins equal, just and peaceful societies: speaking at the International Labour Organisation's World of Work Summit, held annually at the [International Labour Conference](#) in Geneva, Switzerland on 15 June, the first female president of Nepal said the empowerment of women in economic, political, and social spheres is crucial for establishing peace and justice in society. President Bhandari was one of three women heads of state to address the Summit as keynote speakers. She spoke alongside President of Malta Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca and President of Mauritius Ameenah Gurib-Fakim. The issues discussed during the summit included work-family balance; Women, men and the care economy; Violence and harassment as a barrier to decent work for women; and the Gender pay gap/equal pay for work of equal value.

Global Forum on Remittances, Investment, and Development 2017: the conference took place on 15 and 16 June at the United Nations Headquarters in New York. Organised by the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) in collaboration with the World Bank and [UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs \(UN-DESA\)](#), the Forum coincided with the celebration of the [International Day of Family Remittances \(IDFR\)](#) on 16 June.

ALNAP Webinar, “Up to standard: The role of evidence in the Sphere Standard revision process”: taking place on Tuesday, 11 July, from 6:45 PM - 8:15 PM Nepal time, this webinar will look at the how the standards of quality in the Sphere Standards are established, whether they are based on evidence, and why this matters.

Online Training Course, Introduction to Household Water Treatment and Safe Storage: this is a five week course provided by the École Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne. The course covers the most important water treatment methods at household level, successful implementation strategies, and impact assessment of HWTS.

RedR online Urban Humanitarianism training: Following the successful launch of RedR's on-line Urban Humanitarianism training in April, the course will be run a second time this year commencing on 3rd July 2017. The Urban Humanitarianism course aims to explore and develop the necessary skills and knowledge of a humanitarian to effectively work in the early stages of an urban emergency.

Launch of Professional Postgraduate Course in Humanitarian Shelter Coordination: the course is offered by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), in partnership with the Centre for Development and Emergency Practice (CENDEP) at Oxford Brookes University. The course includes five weeks tutored distance learning (16 July to 20 August) and a 6 day face-to-face workshop in Geneva, Switzerland (18 to 23 September 2017). MoUD CLPIU has issued new inspection forms for Dry stone masonry (Nepali) 13 June: [First Inspection Form](#) and [Second Inspection Form](#).

Common Feedback Project (CFP) Reconstruction Report, May 2017: data collection took place during 16-28 April, 1 month earlier than planned, so as not to overlap with the local election process. As there was only a one month gap between perception surveys, the changes between this round and the last are minute, in most cases. However, access to water continues to be a major issue with 44% of respondents identifying this as their number one reconstruction priority, besides house reconstruction. Concerns also remain with respect to differences in the way the reconstruction process is unfolding for vulnerable groups, including women, disadvantaged ethnic groups, the elderly and linguistic minorities. Significant differences in the access to information and the understanding of critical information is apparent among these disadvantaged groups.
