NRA NGO Mobilisation Guidelines + Unofficial Translations	Defines the guiding principles, working areas / sectors, and roles that I/NGOs supporting the reconstruction should work to and adopt.
Community Based Committees Directive + Unofficial Translation	Defines roles of community reconstruction committees, and how they should be established and managed.

Lead Mason Training on Earthquake Resistant Residential Building Construction Directives 2017, (Nepali) (Unofficial English Translation)	Prepared by MoUD CL-PIU. Lead masons are required for On the Job Training used to develop new masons.
NRA MIS Training Reporting Format	Standard format for documenting training records. POs should submit to MoUD DL-PIU and HRRP district team who will submit to NRA MIS.

Summary of geo-hazard survey categorisation of assessed settlements	Results of the NRA geo-hazard assessment which identified settlements and households requiring resettlement because of geo-hazards / damage caused by the 2015 earthquakes.

Procedures for the Relocation and Rehabilitation of Hazard-prone Settlements, 2073 (2017)(Nepali) + Unofficial Translation	Procedures for identifying households requiring resettlement (as per lists above) and implementing resettlement.
Criteria for purchasing habitable lands for earthquake victims, published on 23 June, MoFALD CLPIU (Nepali)	Defines procedures for disbursement of financial support of up to 200,000 NPRs available to households who have been identified as requiring resettlement as well as families living in public land and forest areas, who on the list of eligible households, and do not have land anywhere in Nepal to buy land. This grant is in addition to the 300,000 NPRs housing reconstruction grant.

ToR for Locally Elected Bodies (Nepali)	Defines roles and responsibilities of newly elected officials.
Functional Unbundling Report	Sets out which functions and responsibilities will sit at which levels of government, after federal restructuring.
District Administrative Division Maps (75 districts)	MoFALD maps of new administrative divisions as per federal restructuring.

HRRP Gap Matrix Tool	Developed by the HRRP IM team, this tool provides detailed information on gaps in coverage of the 6 core socio-technical assistance activities. Follow the directions in the
